The beautiful experience of our Easter Ceremonies provided wonderful nourishment for all those who participated here in our parish. The mail is that the same kind of experience was common to many parishes and dioceses over these holy days.

Certainly in our own little home here, while the numbers of people attending the ceremonies seemed larger than in previous years, the real joy was in the prayerful attentiveness of everyone involved. The faith of the people was something palpable, and it was on the shoulders of this faith that we were carried into a real encounter with the Cross on Calvary and with the Risen Jesus.

There was a gentleness of spirit and a great patience on the part of those who couldn't find seats in the Church, but whose joy in just being present was so clearly evident. Conversations and emails following on from our Easter celebrations, tell me that this deep joy was a shared experience for so many.

This deep listening spirit, expressed in silent prayer, in song, in action, seemed to take on a new intensity and focus.

Perhaps there is a new hunger to find a way forward following all the challenges we are facing as a Church. Perhaps for some, the story of Jesus is starting to impact more on our lives as we grow older, and we start to understand where he may be found each day, as the disciples did on that road to Emmaus.

Perhaps the Spirit we receive at Confirmation is breaking through in our community with a new clarity and those Gifts of the Holy Spirit are taking shape in daily life.

Whatever the case, the beautiful ceremonies of Holy Week seemed to carry us all along with them and grace us with a renewed awareness of the presence of the Risen One.

It's easy I suppose to get carried away with all this when for so many Easter simply means time off work, for taking a break, visiting family, going to the Easter Show or the footy or some other recreation. All of these are worthy pursuits and we all need them. .

It's possible to combine the Easter celebrations and good recreation. It's also possible that we push the Easter story to one side in order to devote our whole Easter break simply to recreation.

Our state of health may well make this necessary. We may also regard the Easter celebrations as optional extras for those who are interested but are not really necessary. I can still think of myself as Catholic without going overboard! In this mode I may be a bit like the folk we read about in Acts Chapter 8. They'd been baptised but they didn't quite get what it was all about, or in the words of Acts, they hadn't yet received the Spirit.

It's a bit like when we baptize our children, see that they receive their Sacraments and leave it at that. If we fail to pray with them at home, or fail to help them participate in the life of the community through the regular celebration of Mass and the Sacraments, we limit their opportunities to get a taste for the nourishment that their faith has to offer them.

We may know a few prayers and some of the stories that Jesus has left us. Occasional participation in Mass may serve to keep our connection with the community ticking over, but like those folk in Samaria, we may not really get it. Only a daily encounter with the One who longs to love us into life, will enable us to taste something of the joy and grace our faith means to provide which we glimpsed during our Easter celebrations.

May we take hold of this Easter season to refresh our acquaintance with Him who died and rose and who calls us to become truly a new kind of people.

PETITION TO SUPPORT ANTI-TRAFFICKING LEGISLATION

Following receipt of the following letter, we will have a petition available for your signatures at all Masses this weekend,.

Dear Father Kevin Bates,

I was recently approached to help with a petition for the Modern Slavery Bill 2018. As mentioned in an address by Sydney Archbishop Anthony Fisher, to the Select Committee of the NSW Legislative Council on Human Trafficking in March 2017, most people think human trafficking is a thing of the past, yet the very existence of the Committee is testament to the ongoing problem. Modern slavery practices take many forms and prey on the most vulnerable in societies. Pope Francis has called it a 'crime against humanity'.

*As Christians we are called to help eradicate such practices in order to liberate victims currently trapped in the slavery web. Also included herewith is an email from the Anti-Slavery Taskforce commissioned by Archbishop Fisher encouraging me to help in this anti-slavery petition. It is hoped that we can reach the target of **over 10,000 signatures** in order that the Parliament is obliged to discuss the matter.*

I would like to seek your support and approval to have the petition advertised in the church bulletins. It would also help tremendously if the celebrant priest can mention during mass about the call for Christians to help eradicating human trafficking as it has been done by many Christians from the earliest times in history.

Acts 4:32-35

These few verses from the Acts of the Apostles remind us of what is central to the life of the Christian community: unity in faith in God's word leading to a sharing of that faith through witnessing to the Lord's resurrection, and a sharing of the things that sustain our life.
