Something new needs to be born now that the work of the Royal Commission into Institutional Child Sexual Abuse has completed its work. As Pope Francis has noted, the Church in this country and abroad, needs to reflect deeply on the findings and recommendations of the Commission, and turn these reflections into appropriate actions.

As the body most thoroughly examined and critiqued by the Commission and subsequently by the media, the Catholic Church has much work still to do to attend to the needs of people so devastated by the abuse over many decades. This is of course our first priority.

Many steps are already being taken in this regard. Processes are in place and constantly being reviewed and improved. Compliance requirements are being tightened in order that children in particular and people in general are protected into the future. Each parish and community are required to participate in these new arrangements.

There is no going back to a past in which we imagined that the Church was somehow beyond critique. We need great faith and courage to engage with this new reality.

In the midst of all our failure and pain, great good is still being created in the Church in so many ways. The recent Catholic Youth Festival was an instance of this as 19,000 young people from all around Australia came together for three days of prayer, celebration and hope.

Such events don't rate much of a mention in the media. The Seven network gave generous coverage to the Festival, Nine, a little and the ABC not a whisper. The ABC with their bland secularism gives barely any coverage of any good the Church does, while the Church becomes instant news whenever our failures come to light. They crawl all over every story, enhancing it with exaggeration and great righteousness. Having said that, the criticism is so often well deserved. No less deserving would be a word of acceptance and even praise for a something God's People do well!

This climate frames our present reality, and it's in this same climate that we engage in the process of healing, healing within the Church, healing within each wounded heart, healing in the world around us.

There can be no escaping into our own inner sanctum in order to avoid the climate "out there." We buy a cheap freedom if we hide behind our own well-worn prayers, devotions and practices as if everything will be ok if we hold on for long enough and keep our heads down. Our healing as a Church must happen in a world where the Church's credibility is at a very low ebb. It is in this newly-foreign secular place that the Good News of Jesus needs to be born again.

When we act with integrity in a business world that is built on cutting corners, moral compromise and rampant egos, then Jesus is born again. When we nurture children with patience and call them home to the heart of love in our family prayer and in our teaching, then Jesus is born again. When we work in our wider families to achieve reconciliation where only division has ruled, then Jesus is born again. When we listen attentively and humbly to the cries of those who have been damaged within the Church, then Jesus is born again. When we take up the cross created by our own sins and troubles, and allow mercy to shape our hearts, then Jesus is born again.

Our healing as a Church will be long, slow and patchy. Jesus was born into troubled, corrupt times and he remains our hope in this new season, this present fractured reality that is ours.

May he be born into your hearts and homes this Christmas time and through you, into a world which longs for the healing that only he can bring. With great love and hope I pray for each of you, a blessed, joyful, new-born heart this Christmas.
