You know the experience of sitting on a beach and looking out to sea, trying to imagine what is over the horizon. Likewise, sitting quietly at night under the blazing stars, you can't help but feel how tiny you are in the scheme of things and yet so very precious. Blue hills in the distance, a plane disappearing into the clouds, a quiet violin line disappearing into a wealth of orchestral sound, all serve to call us beyond ourselves and into the mystery that lies at the edge of things.

These glimpses of the beyond, these opportunities to ponder immensity and beauty, can, if we are alert enough, draw us into the sacredness of things. Here is the sort of truth that is beyond our management skills, our gift of analysis, our clever planning for the future.

Here we are in the presence of mystery, and in our smallness and sense of being insignificant, we feel somehow a new completeness. It is here we are part not just of ourselves but of something far grander, more mysterious and un-sayable than a day's ordinary tasks seem to allow us. Like the disciples on the mountain with Jesus in today's gospel, our world is transfigured.

Lent offers us this invitation to scan the horizons of our lives, within and beyond ourselves. Like the micro-biologist exploring the intimacies of the atom and the astronomer searching out the mysteries of the heavens, we can find ourselves entranced before life's great tapestry and allow ourselves to be called into a communion with this awe-creating universe.

Now this idyllic encounter with God's great universe seems a long way off when my horizons are more constricted than expanded.

For instance when my horizon is profit and loss, then I'm caught up in the sterile, ultimately fruitless quest to be wealthier, somehow believing that wealth equates to happiness. I'm constantly looking over my shoulder, not at the mystery or beauty in things but at the threat of competition, the insecurity of the markets and risks I am taking with investments. When this becomes my preoccupation, my soul atrophies and I can no longer see beyond to any horizon other than the illusion that wealth will be my place of safety. Our society is riddled with this obsessive "faith", which has no room for any god other than itself and which regards any religious or spiritual encounter as a distracting interruption to life's real game.

The consequence then is an unhappy, restless soul, and an unhappy restless world, filled with insecurity and the sort of aggression that allows no room for other intrusions.

We can allow ourselves to be enslaved by other such pseudo-horizons such as the need to look good at all times, the inability to grieve my ageing and the denial of its inevitable role in my life. Our horizon could be simply the pressure that we feel to fit in, whether it be with our peers, (with whom we are often in a subtle competitive mode), our kids' sporting coaches who make training "compulsory", as if we have no choice in the matter anymore, or our partner in life whose needy self makes little or no room for our own dreams to flourish. Sadly, we settle for these false horizons as the best we can manage at the time, perhaps thinking that things will be better next year!

"A humble contrite heart you will not scorn", cries the Psalmist in God's presence. Here we recognise that the horizons that really matter, the horizons that call to us as gifts rather than obligations or obsessions, can only be reached for when we are truly free to explore, to listen, to wait and to hunger deeply. May this Lent continue to be the training ground in which your imagination is freed up and your mind loosened. May the un-knowable God give you a glimpse of that horizon that alone is your destiny and if you like, your true place in the sun! Father Kevin
