"I AM SENDING YOU OUT LIKE LAMBS AMONG WOLVES"

In this Sunday's gospel Jesus appoints and then sends out a group of people to go on mission in pairs instructing them to travel with no money bags, sandals or sack and be grateful for what people offer you. He instructs them to always start with words of peace as they enter a home.

Such words will either be accepted or rejected but never lost. Where you are not welcome do not let your heart be troubled or let that rejection burden you; the teacher arrives when the student is ready.

At some point those appointed return and rejoice, a little elated, perhaps sharing a few high fives along the way. They have witnessed, and importantly as a pair, the power of this gift they have received from Jesus; curing the sick, even 'demons' are subject to us because of your name' they say.

Ok sounds great, one for team Jesus, but if I were honest, I would probably get stuck at the thought of leaving home without my iPhone or shopping bags even with my wife by my side. I cannot imagine turning up to Woolies and offering healing to the person at check out in lieu of payment. But is that what this gospel is saying?

Take marriage as an example. We start with the "I Do", sent out in pairs to love, to serve each other, perhaps raise a family. Along the way we experience seasons of peace, rejection, joy, frustration, isolation, happiness, sickness, exhaustion, and a few other things, I am sure.

Although we may try to travel lightly, we may find past experiences find their way into the present bringing with it a sense of weight to our 'pair'. A previous unresolved argument or fear or frustration grows under the surface, making it difficult to enter the town of peace.

Differing views on raising children or having to find a way to let go of your expectations of your partner, ex-partner, children and even oneself are part of the journey Jesus sends us out on mission. But just as he says in this week's gospel, he sends us out to the place he "intends to visit". Where is that place?

I wonder whether it is a place deep within us, a place where he is already there waiting for us. A place where if we can find the space to sit still, we can hear, even for a fleeting moment that little voice that says, I love you, yes, I chose you to be my beloved disciple, thank you for going on the journey.

In sharing life with others, be it our spouse, friend or even those we struggle or have difficulty with we are invited to become more fully human, to become more Christ like. Perhaps that is what we mean to be created in Gods image and likeness, to experience relationship.

Last Wednesday I hosted the orthodox chaplain who came to visit orthodox inmates bringing them holy communion. As we went out as a pair to one of the maximum-security wings, we found the 2 inmates who were on his list. As he sat with them, I found myself surrounded by initially a handful and within minutes over a dozen inmates who too wanted to receive holy communion and a blessing with oil.

The town had welcomed us with open arms and were hungry to be fed. What is usually a very active wing turned into a place of peace for 10-15 minutes as more men joined to partake in this spur of the moment prayer and communion service.

Father John and I had gone in with *just* the Eucharist and oil not sure what we would encounter but what ended up was a glimpse of the kingdom of God at hand as these men so prayerfully and peacefully engaged in this sacred moment of healing. In return the hungry had fed those sent.

So go gently this week, thanking God for all those who have been *sent* to be part of your inner journey because like you, they too have their names written in heaven and that is well worth rejoicing over.

OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE TALK

Paul Glynn will give a short talk on **Wednesday July 6** with a 1.5 metre picture of the Miraculous image at **HNOM Church** after morning Mass and Rosary, **about 9:50 am**. All welcome to come.

The first of the modern apparitions of Mary was at Guadalupe in Mexico, early in the 16th Century. The Spanish conquistadores were treating the Aztecs in Mexico badly, despising them. Mary appeared to St Juan Diego looking like an Aztec rather than a white European, leaving her famous image on Juan Diego's tilma. Tilmas last 20-30 years before disintegrating. The tilma of St Juan Diego with the image of Mary has lasted perfectly since December 1531. St Juan Diego's feast day is December 9, and Our Lady of Guadalupe is December 12. Every year 20 million people visit the shrine in Mexico City. 13 million people visit on or around the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Thomas The Apostle
July 3rd



Poor Thomas! He made one remark and has been branded as "Doubting Thomas" ever since. But if he doubted, he also believed. He made what is certainly the most explicit statement of faith in the New Testament: "My Lord and my God!" (John 20:24-28) and, in so expressing his faith, gave Christians a prayer that will be said till the end of time. He also occasioned a compliment from Jesus to all later Christians: "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed" (John 20:29). Thomas should be equally well known for his courage. Perhaps what he said was impetuous—since he ran, like the rest, at the showdown—but he can scarcely have been insincere when he expressed his willingness to die with Jesus. The occasion was when Jesus proposed to go to Bethany after Lazarus had died. Since Bethany was near Jerusalem, this meant walking into the very midst of his enemies and to almost certain death. Realizing this Thomas said to the other apostles. "Let us also go to die with him": (John 11:16b)

The Lord appointed seventy-two
others and sent them out ahead of
him, in pairs, to all the towns and
places he himself was to visit. He
said to them, 'The harvest is rich
but the labourers are few, so ask
the Lord of the harvest to send
labourers to his harvest. Start off
now, but remember, I am sending
you out like lambs among wolves.
Carry no purse, no haversack, no
sandals. Salute no one on the
road. Whatever house you go into,
let your first words be, "Peace to
this house!" And if a man of peace
lives there, your peace will go and
rest on him; if not, it will come back
to you. Stay in the same house,
taking what food and drink they
have to offer, for the labourer de-
serves his wages; do not move

from house to house. Whenever
you go into a town where
they make you welcome, eat what
is set before you. Cure those in it
who are sick, and say, "The king-
dom of God is very near to you."

[But whenever you enter a town
and they do not make you wel-
come, go out into its streets and
say, "We wipe off the very dust of
your town that clings to our feet,
and leave it with you. Yet be sure
of this: the kingdom of God is very
near." I tell you, on that day it will
not go as hard with Sodom as with
that town.]

The seventy-two came back rejoic-
ing. 'Lord,' they said, 'even the
devils submit to us when we use
your name.' He said to them, 'I
watched Satan fall like lightning
from heaven. Yes, I have given
you power to tread underfoot ser-
pents and scorpions and the whole
strength of the enemy; nothing
shall ever hurt you. Yet do not
rejoice that the spirits submit to
you; rejoice rather that your names
are written in heaven.']
