Dear All,

I received the following email this week in response to last week's story about our conversations at the Youth Mass the other week. It's a very thoughtful piece from our parishioner Richard Attrill and is too good not to share with you. I can hear a broader conversation emerging early in the new year which may answer some of the questions Richard raises and which we discussed at Mass the other evening. I invite you to reflect on Richard's piece and start engaging with the questions he raises with each other. Let's see what might emerge in terms of broader conversations into the new year and more fruitful, practical action. Father Kevin

Dear Father Kevin,

I hope you are well and want to share some thoughts inspired by your bulletin. On reading your reflections: "A lively conversation" after church at St Peter Chanel, this morning, this got me thinking.

The Parish, what do we want more of etc. I asked myself why I go to church? My colleagues either personally and professionally have asked me the same question- I have been in banking for 30 years! In the mad business world standing out saying one is a regular church goer sometime challenges people.

My response in the last 5 years since arriving in Australia is always the same. It is my time to reflect. How has the week gone? Have I been a good husband, father and friend, neighbour and colleague? What could I do better? Listen to the scriptures and try and take something out – like today – Mathew – "walking the talk" - In my current studies (masters in Psychology and coaching) I came across an expression that really resonates with me.

"The quality of our conversations determines the quality of our relationships- the quality of our relationships determines the quality of our families and communities..." –Are we talking and listening to our friends and neighbours? At work or home there are too many distractions? Church is one place one can truly reflect, and in my experience we don't do enough reflection and to some point sharing. I asked myself today in church, I wonder why everyone else comes. Reflection is 3 dimensional – Inward – outward and overtime.

The outward piece here is really important – the impact on others- And so I ponder, if we shared this, through you, why we come, we might inspire and help each other. Most services are delivered one way –the priest the readings and the congregation: "A priest up there and us down here" – however we are challenged to be part of a community- but we don't share. Now this takes a lot of trust which is founded on non- judgemental acceptance – and the ability to feel comfortable being vulnerable- so many great examples in New Testament of Jesus here! If we are truly to act and behave like a community perhaps we need to do this more- reflect and share? This is a modern-day challenge bearing in mind how we live in our homes.

I would be interested in why others come? We might be able to inspire, and help each more – if we knew? Imagine – if there was someone sitting a few rows in front of me – who was asking for help and guidance through prayer on something at home – that any number of people might be able to help with... isn't that a community? It could be something quite simple. If we helped one person each week – that's 52 happier families a year? and more from the sense of helping each other. These things don't need to be personal – they can be practical. Someone helping with something in a garden, helping fix something at home, giving someone a lift somewhere for an appointment- all normal neighbourly community stuff.
