SEPARATE AND TOGETHER

You are God's work of art, written not with ink but with the love of the Holy Spirit, not on tablets of stone but across the pages of your human hearts (2 Cor 3:2-3).

Recently, we had a death in the family - the precious matriarch of the family. As we sat with her for a few hours after her death, we recalled our favourite moments we had shared with her. What we came to realise was how 'extraordinarily ordinary' her life was. Ordinary because she had no profile outside of the communities she had lived in over the years. Extraordinary because she treated everyone with equal kindness. She was open-hearted and welcomed each person as they were. She had the ability to listen with empathy and without judgement. As St Paul says she was 'God's work of art'. We can all probably think of someone we know who similarly inspires us. We, too, can think of ourselves as 'God's work of art'.

We take ourselves as works of art into our communal settings. Our Parish is made up of unique individuals and the collective spirit of the group is apparent whenever our congregation gathers together to celebrate. Our parish dinner was an occasion of hard work, celebration, friendship and generosity on many levels. The personal gifts shared by many people made the evening very enjoyable. We can think back too, on our Holy Thursday to Easter Sunday ceremonies when consciousness of God's presence was particularly strong. Each ceremony had its own spirit of prayerfulness. It was a profound experience of 'communal oneness' and an expression of our collective faith: the congregation at each ceremony was a different mix of participants who, by coming together, brought the Spirit alive. We all appreciate that God is everywhere, but our parish church is the place where we intentionally recall the presence of God and the gift we are to each other: each of us has something unique to contribute - each of us matters.

A few years back a small group of us went to Sunday Mass in the cathedral in Colombo. The cathedral was full and the devotion of the congregation was palpable. At the conclusion of Mass there was a hurried exit of people presumably having to get to work. Minutes after receiving the Eucharist, they were 'out the door': they were taking Christ with them into their world. As an observer, it was a very powerful experience and a reminder that each of us as God's work of art, is 'a carrier of divinity' wherever we go.



But being God's work of art is not an end in itself but is a twofold responsibility to use our gifts to sustain and enrich our catholic community; secondly to open our eyes to the needs of people in the wider community. There are 30+ active groups within our parish. Some groups support the internal functioning of our parish; other groups have an outward focus on the needs within our local or the wider community; while other groups have both an internal and external focus. We can be proud of the work undertaken by our parish teams. Whatever our personal level of involvement, we are all the church 'in action'.

This week, let's try to notice, and thank God for the opportunity to be his work of art and to notice the beautiful gifts alive in those we meet.

"May we continue to share our gifts of life and love with glad and generous hearts. May our world be somehow more alive because we have passed this way."



This Week... SCRIPTURE & PRAYER ZONE

First Reading Acts 9:26-31

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

My children, our love is not to be just words or mere talk, but something real and active; only by this can we be certain that we are the children of the truth and be able to quieten our conscience in his presence, whatever accusations it may raise against us, because God is greater than our conscience and he knows everything.

My dear people, if we cannot be condemned by our own conscience, we need not be afraid in God's presence, and whatever we ask him, we shall receive, because we keep his commandments and live the kind of life that he wants.

His commandments are these: that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and that we love one another as he told us to.
