"Love one another as I have loved you"

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER Year B

In a certain sense both the second reading (1 John) and the Gospel (John) have a very simple message. God is love and all love comes from God. We are called to love one another as Jesus loves us and it is through this love our joy will be complete. We are taught that we are Jesus's friends, not his slaves and called to remain in God's love. One could say the whole Christian message is summed up for us in this week's readings.

When our world and all that surrounds us is in a good place, where people are working well with us, our relationships are stable, our spouses agree with us, our work colleagues think we are brilliant or our children are listening to and following their parents' instructions, one could say it is easy to love.

However, how does this love hold up when things get a little messy? We start disagreeing with our spouses, bringing up past issues, words get a little sharper and patience gets a little thinner or the intimacy fades. How do we respond when work colleagues, friends or school or sports parents start behaving in a way that gravitates towards gossip or exclusion? Or how do we love those whose actions - or threat of - required us to flee our homeland wherever that may be?

What of those who commit the crimes that have occupied the news items for the past few weeks from the man who killed the innocent people at Bondi Junction or the teenage boy who walked into that church or those who then turned up in revenge?

How can I live out this "love one another as I have loved you" in such circumstances whereby the very fabric of how I understand and need my society to operate is threatened? Are we not prone to our hearts being hardened or perhaps more cynical, more cautious, lest trusting and more judgemental?

I wonder whether it is in this messiness, this place of confusion, of fear, revenge, hatred or brokenness where the Gospel really finds its true ground. Is this not the contradiction that finds its place in the Christian message of the Cross? Maybe it is here where we are reminded of the words Jesus spoke, "Father, forgive them for they do not know what they are doing." Is this not love itself speaking from the Cross, at times helpless and still praying for those who have hurt us?

One may ask, why do I need to be reminded of this? Perhaps because it allows us the very slight possibility to change the way we see each other and ourselves. A metanoia of sorts to soften our gaze to all those around us that we find hard to love, which in turn awakens in us our own areas that fall short of the mark. It is here that we reminded of Peters words, "I myself am also a human being" in need of Gods infinite love and mercy.

In Holy Week last year, during the homily in our Last Supper liturgy we reflected on the love of oneself, which is not a narcissistic trait but rather a love that lends itself towards taking time to care for one's soul, body and mind, resting in God's presence, allowing one to care for the temple in which God lives.

During the washing of the feet part of this liturgy, which followed, one of the men who allowed me to wash his feet had tattooed 'narcissist' up along his leg. At the end of the service, this young man came up to me with this look of amazement.

He wanted to let me know that his narcissistic behaviours had stemmed from the need to compensate for his deep belief that he was not worthy of being loved, an understanding born out of an unfortunate upbringing which in turn led to much damage through his online actions. Wounds transmitted rather than transformed.

But now for the first time he was able to see that he was worthy of being loved because the very God who created him, who lived inside of him, loved him. For that man that was his 'aha' moment that changed everything.

May we see with the eyes of a heart that is not hardened, that is not drowned by the thoughts of the mind but is awakened to a love that is freely given to each one of us by a God who does not show any partiality. Amen. **Richard Korkor**

This Week... SCRIPTURE & PRAYER ZONE

First Reading Acts 10:25–26, 34–35, 44–48

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up', he said 'I am only a man after all!'

Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.
